

All We Canuary is the new fundraising challenge from All We Can. The concept is simple - do all the *something* you can in January 2024 and fundraise for All We Can in the process!

All We Canuary is the perfect time of year for schools to engage with the work of All We Can. It's fun, it's (optionally!) competitive, and easy to join in with.

We hope All We Canuary provides an exciting way to involve your young people in fundraising and to teach them a little about global poverty along the way.

Teachers and young people are more than welcome to engage with the main fundraising challenge, but we've put together some ideas of how to make All We Canuary even more suited for a school context.

Month-long events

For most people, All We Canuary will involve tracking a particular activity for the whole month of January. There are a couple of options for adapting this concept in a school:

One possibility would be to decide on a particular activity for the whole school and track the cumulative total of everyone's efforts. For example, perhaps as a school you could run/walk the 5,000km from the UK to Liberia! Different year groups could also compete against each other to do the most of whatever activity is chosen.

Alternatively, each year group/form class could choose their own challenge so there are lots of different activities happening across the school, and the children have more ownership over their fundraising.

In either case, there are many challenges which could engaging and enriching for your students:



Could your school do all the...

- Steps/miles
- Books
- Facts
- Volunteering
- Energy saving

- Pictures/drawings
- New skills
- New foods
- Plant growing

...you can?

There might also be a particular aspect of your school's vision or curriculum that would tie in nicely. In all cases, students could seek sponsors per-action (e.g. £1 per mile) or general sponsorship (e.g. 'please sponsor me as I try to do as many miles as I can in January!').

One-off events

If you are dipping your toes into the All We Can waters for the first time, or you do not have the capacity to organise a month-long challenge, perhaps you could still hold a one-off event which maintains the spirit of All We Canuary.

Instead of a challenge over the course of a month, you could do all the you can on a particular day – allowing for a more intensive and focussed fundraising event that will be easy to invite parents and the local community to.

For example:

- 'All the cakes you can' bake sale.
- All the car washing you can.
- 'All the talent you can' full day talent show.
- All the art you can. Organise a whole-school art project where everyone paints a tile for a mosaic, for example.
- All the food you can an evening celebrating foods from different countries/cultures.
